# THIRTY— THIRD IN ORDINARY TIME 16TH NOVEMBER 2025

Our readings bring with them intense, even dramatic, images of endings—destruction, persecution, and a future wrapped in uncertainty. But these passages aren't meant to frighten us; on the contrary, they call us to be a people of perseverance and hope. In the Gospel, Christ speaks not just of a future event, but of a continual state of being. He tells us that the temple will fall, that there will be wars and distress, yet He urges us: "Do not be alarmed." Why? Because these disruptions are signs of something new breaking through. The essential message is this: the Kingdom of God is already at work, even when the world around us seems chaotic.

Perseverance, then, is not about grimly hanging on until the end. It is about actively living the Gospel in the *now*, regardless of circumstance. It is the quiet heroism of the person who continues to serve, to love, and to remain faithful when the world demands compromise or despair. As Saint Augustine of Hippo wisely reminds us, "God had one son on earth without sin, but never one without suffering." assuring us that our path, like Christ's, includes the cross.

This Sunday challenges us to examine the quality of our hope. Is our hope rooted in the stability of this world—in financial security, political peace, or personal comfort—all things that can, and will, pass away? Or is our hope fixed on the unwavering reality of Christ's promise? Pope Saint John Paul II gives us the ultimate assurance in this regard: "The cross means there is no shipwreck without hope. There is no dark without dawn, no storm without haven." It is the deep-rooted faith that knows the final victory has already been won by Christ, and that our current struggles are temporary.

This week, let's embrace the quiet call to vigilance. Let us prepare for the return of the Lord not by scanning the horizon for signs of disaster, but by committing ourselves daily to acts of justice, mercy, and compassion. When we live fully in the light of the present moment, loving God and neighbor, we are truly prepared for whatever the future holds, knowing that Christ's love is the one thing that will endure forever.

Through the same Christ our Lord Amen.





#### READINGS OF THE DAY THIRTY THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME—YEAR C

#### First Reading

Malachi 3:19-20

The sun of righteousness will shine on you.

The day is coming now, burning like a furnace; and all the arrogant and the evil-doers will be like stubble. The day that is coming is going to burn them up, says the Lord of hosts, leaving them neither root nor stalk. But for you who fear my name, the sun of righteousness will shine out with healing in its rays.

## Responsorial Psalm

#### (R.) The Lord comes to rule the earth with justice.

## Second Reading

2 Thessalonians 3:7-12

Do not give anyone food who refuses to work.

You know how you are supposed to imitate us: now we were not idle when we were with you, nor did we ever have our meals at anyone's table without paying for them; no, we worked night and day, slaving and straining, so as not to be a burden on any of you. This was not because we had no right to be, but in order to make ourselves an example for you to follow.

We gave you a rule when we were with you: not to let anyone have any food if he refused to do any work. Now we hear that there are some of you who are living in idleness, doing no work themselves but interfering with everyone else's. In the Lord Jesus Christ, we order and call on people of this kind to go on quietly working and earning the food that they eat.

#### Gospel

Luke 21:5-19

Your endurance will win you your life.

When some were talking about the Temple, remarking how it was adorned with fine stonework and votive offerings, Jesus said, 'All these things you are staring at now – the time will come when not a single stone will be left on another: everything will be destroyed.' And they put to him this question: 'Master,' they said, 'when will this happen, then, and what sign will there be that this is about to take place?'

'Take care not to be deceived,' he said, 'because many will come using my name and saying, "I am he" and, "The time is near at hand." Refuse to join them. And when you hear of wars and revolutions, do not be frightened, for this is something that must happen but the end is not soon.' Then he said to them, 'Nation will fight against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be great earthquakes and plagues and famines here and there; there will be fearful sights and great signs from heaven.

'But before all this happens, men will seize you and persecute you; they will hand you over to the synagogues and to imprisonment, and bring you before kings and governors because of my name – and that will be your opportunity to bear witness. Keep this carefully in mind: you are not to prepare your defence, because I myself shall give you an eloquence and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to resist or contradict. You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, relations and friends; and some of you will be put to death. You will be hated by all men on account of my name, but not a hair of your head will be lost. Your endurance will win you your lives.'
