

THE GLORY RETURNS TO THE TEMPLE

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In our Gospel today, Jesus is continuing His very challenging teaching in the Sermon on the Mount. In particular He tells us that we must even love our enemies and pray for those who persecute us. Well that is just not what naturally comes to us, is it? Sure we love those who love us, but how can we love those who hate us? We can only do it with a lot of help. We need grace from God to do something like that. But let us be under no illusions, Jesus says that by loving our enemies, we will be children of our Father in Heaven. If we don't love our enemies, we will not be His children.

When Saint Teresa of Calcutta (Mother Teresa) accepted the Nobel Peace Prize in Oslo in 1979, part of her acceptance speech went like this:

"It is not enough for us to say: 'I love God, but I do not love my neighbour.' Saint John says that you are a liar if you say you love God and you don't love your neighbour (1 John 4:20). How can you love God whom you do not see, if you do not love your neighbour whom you see, whom you touch,

with whom you live? And so this is very important for us to realise that love, to be true, has to hurt."

How can we love like this? It is a grace to forgive, and when the hurt is great we may need to pray a great deal for the grace to forgive. Saint Teresa wrote:

"To be able to love one another, we must pray much, for prayer gives a clean heart, and a clean heart can see God in our neighbour. If now we have no peace,

it is because we have forgotten how to see God in one another."

In one of the videos of the Alpha Course, we hear Corrie Ten Boom, a Dutch Christian woman who had been savagely maltreated by Nazis in the Ravensbrück concentration camp, where her sister died. She survived the war and her strong Christian faith enabled her to forgive those who had done such harm to her and her family. After the war, she was giving talks to Christian groups, and after one such talk in Germany, a man approached her and said that he had been one of the guards at Ravensbrück, but that he asked God to forgive him and he was now a Christian. He asked Corrie to shake his hand. She remembered him well, and into her mind flashed all the despicable things this man had done. He was asking her to forgive him. She said to herself: "I cannot forgive". Then she realised that God could forgive even if she could not, and she found strength to take this man's hand. In that moment, she found she could forgive him, and both of them came a little closer to healing of their spirits.


The San Carlo Association will be celebrating 35th

Now over 4,000 titles of award-winning Catholic content, children's programming, audio talks, e-books and more, are available on almost any internet-connected device (PC's, tablets, smart phones and smart TV's etc.) The new platform was produced after consultation and feedback from the users (now over 900,000) across 5,000 parish communities. The new platform has improved performance and an enhanced search tool. It allows offline playback and you no longer have to remember a password because access is now simply through your e-mail address.

For existing subscribers just visit formed.org then click 'Sign In' and enter your email address. You will be sent an e-mail and when you click on the link in the email you're in! No more passwords! You can stay signed in even when you close your browser or your device is off. When you go back to formed.org just click on 'sign in' and you can start watching again.
