## The Lent season is only beginning and it is not too late to log in and start watching with family, friends or attend a group session at Cathedral Centre

Would you like to grow in your relationship with Jesus Christ? Do you know someone who has fallen away from the Church, perhaps a friend, a family member, or a co-worker, and you want reach them, but you just don't know how to?

With beautiful film-making and teaching on the Sacrament of Reconciliation, *FORGIVEN* will move your heart and give you plenty to discuss as a family or group of friends. The program will be 5 weeks in length, with an episode to watch each week. Formed can be accessed on smart phone, tablet, computer or smart TV.

Our Lenten Study can be undertaken at home using the formed website and can be done individually or in groups. This is a great opportunity to get together with family members or friends and go deeper into our faith together. There will be ample assistance for those who want to host a small group at home.

#### It will also be run on Mondays, morning and evening, in the Cathedral Centre.

#### **BOUND FOR GLORY.**

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Today, our Gospel (Mk 9:2-10) gives testimony to the amazing scene witnessed by Peter, James and John when Jesus revealed to them His glory; when He showed them a glimpse of His divinity and a glimpse of heaven. We call it the 'Transfiguration' but in Greek they call it the 'Metamorphosis' Jesus, the man, appears transformed – radiant with intense light and with Him were the great prophetic saints of the Old Testament, Elijah and Moses who were talking with Him. This scene was, for those three apostles, a glimpse into the eternal reality of heaven. And so it is for us too.



St Ephrem the Deacon (the 4th Century Syrian Doctor of the Church) wrote that Jesus took these three apostles up the mountain for three reasons: First, to show them the glory of His divinity. Secondly, to declare Himself to be Israel's redeemer and thirdly to prevent the apostles' from being scandalised at seeing Him soon afterwards enduring the human sufferings which He freely accepted for our sake. He took them up the mountain in order to show them His kingship before they witnessed His passion, to let them see His mighty power before they watched His death and to reveal His glory to them before they beheld His humiliation.

In all the subsequent trials that these apostles were to go through, they would remember that scene of Christ in unutterable glory conversing with these saints in heaven and they would be encouraged with great hope in Jesus' promise that if they remained true to Him they would one day share that glory with Him permanently in heaven.

We too, would do well to ponder this vision of Christ in glory, because we too are offered a place in it (see John 17:20-25). It is the same sort of vision St Stephen had of Jesus in glory just before he gave his life for fearlessly proclaiming Jesus and His Gospel. Let us put our trust in Jesus who by His cross and resurrection can transform our lives if we put them under his hand. Like Moses and Elijah and all the saints, Jesus can change us to be like Him even to giving us a share in His divine glory so long as we let Him.

Lent is a time for us to consider if we are following close to Jesus or only paying lip service. He said "If you love Me, you will keep My commandments. And I will ask the Father, and He will give you another Helper, to be with you for ever" (John 14:15-16). Through Jesus' amazing love for us, God will give us all the help we need to be transformed so we can eventually share His glory. Let us be encouraged as we take up our crosses daily that the end of this, our journey with Jesus, will be absolutely glorious.

This week through Project Compassion



Margret's school now has enough water for its students and the capacity to cater for more, with plans to boost food security, through increased agricultural production.







#### St Mary's Cathedral Bookshop

Cathedral Restoration Update

Last year the Cathedral Restoration project was launched. After an investigation seeking a suitable local architect, the Restoration Commission has approved Peter Walker of Cumulus Studios. Peter and his team have had meetings with the steering committee and begun to scope the work. This will involve an application to Hobart City Council. At the present time the focus is on the lighting and heating options. Various proposals are being explored but no decisions have been made. Discussions have also been held with Heritage Tasmania in preparation of seeking Development Application approval from the Hobart City Council. It is hoped that there will be a commencement of works this calendar year.
