The 8th August is the Solemnity of St Mary of the Cross (Mary MacKillop).

Mary MacKillop is Australia's first saint. She led a remarkable life in service of others.

From her early life in looking after and teaching children in Penola, South Australia to the establishment of schools across Australia for any child who wished to learn, regardless of whether they could pay for their education. Mary declared her intention to serve God as a religious sister and became Sister Mary of the Cross.

Mary MacKillop is not only the first Australian to be recognised by the Church as a Saint, she is truly a very

Australian saint. She characterises the spirit of the Australian mythology. She was a prodigious hard worker who put the needs of others before herself. She exhibited something of the larrikin spirit: constantly in dispute with authority but pressing on, regardless. She used the strengths of others but also didn't tolerate those who were not genuine. Her commitment to the schooling of children from poor and rural communities established a model of Catholic education that continues to today.

Next weekend on Sunday the 15th August is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. In honour of the Blessed Virgin Mary, The Rosary will be prayed before each of the weekend Masses at St Mary's Cathedral and at the Sacred Heart Church.

We are Called to Become Another Saint!

Last Sunday, 1st of August, will be remembered in history as the most successful day ever for the Australian Olympic team. Four gold medals two in the pool, one in BMX freestyle and one in the sailing – surpassing the previous best daily haul. However, Australia has never before had its anthem played four times on the same day.

Emma McKeon the undoubted star of Australia's super Sunday was one of the most humble team member, who became a role model to every Australian. Her four golds and three bronze medals in Tokyo have made her the most decorated Australian athlete at a single Olympics. It is a truly historic achievement.

In a same way, for Australian Catholic Church history was made on Sunday 17th October 2010, as Blessed Mary MacKillop was canonised in Rome and becomes Australia's first declared saint by Pope Benedict XVI in St Peter's Square.

This was a historic day for the Church and for Australia, as the Universal Church recognises Mary MacKillop as someone who lived a life of heroic goodness, born of her closeness to God and her love of all she met, particularly the poor and marginalised. In canonising her, the Church holds Mary up to us and to all who come after us, as a special companion and example for us in our own lives.

In an interview, when the media asked Emma about her achievement, with characteristic humility, McKeon brushed off her monumental medal haul and said. "I only hear from you guys [the media] those kind of stats. I look at the athletes that have come before me. I've been so impressed by what they've done, so inspired. But I've never really been into the stats of the medal counts. But to be in that kind of company, it's an honour. I know that I've worked hard for it."

Emma McKeon's words reminded me our beloved St Mary MacKillop word's, who opened the first account for Australians in Saintly Kingdom. She said once, "Whatever troubles may be before you, accept them bravely, remembering whom you are trying to follow. Do not be afraid. Love one another, bear with one another, and let charity guide you all your life. God will reward you as only He can."

McKeon's historic glory in the pool was central to motivate each and every Australian to become an Olympian. Whereas, St Mary Mackillop's historic and saintly life inspire every Christian in Australia to become another Saint. Her legacy continues today in countless ways. Mary MacKillop has shown us how to forgive and how to be compassionate; she teaches us about sanctity and is a saint for all of us today. Her perseverance, determined spirit, faith and integrity are a constant inspiration to many young women, her life empowering generations to "never see a need without doing something about it."







FEAST DAY -14TH AUGUST

St. Maximilian Kolbe was born as Raymund Kolbe on January 8, 1894, in Poland. He was a Polish Conventual Franciscan friar and a martyr in the German death Camp of Auschwitz during World War II.



Kolbe joined the Conventual Franciscans and in 1910, he was given the religious name Maximilian, after being allowed to enter the novitiate, and in 1911, he professed his first vows. In 1918 he was ordained a priest and continued his work of promoting Mary throughout Poland.

In WW11, Kolbe was arrested and taken to Auschwitz. Never abandoning his priesthood, Kolbe was not chosen but volunteered to take the place of a man with a family to face death by starvation. Kolbe led prayers to Our Lady with the prisoners and died at Auschwitz death camp on 14th August 1941.
