# **COURAGE, IT IS I COME!**

Memory is a great gift of the mind where we can recall previous life experiences. After reading and reflecting on St. Matthew's Gospel 14: 22-33 relating the narrative of the storm at sea, my mind firstly wandered back to an event which happened in PNG. It was Scary! We four PBVM sisters; Margaret, Maria, Bridie and myself were about to ford a swift flowing coastal river — waist deep or more! Bridie was first to step into the river and within a few seconds was being drawn into a swirling quick sand hole. Two of us scrambled onto a nearby fallen tree trunk which thank God was close by. With the aid of a branch which had been handed to us we were able to pull Bridie to safety. Between us all the conversation went like this," don't panic; keep calm; stay still, hold on tight; trust us." When I recall this event we three were the ones trying not to panic.

In the Gospel for today we read about the disciples' frightening experience as the boat they were in was being tossed about by the swirling winds and mountainous sea. Jesus came to them through the storm calling, 'Courage,' It is I — do not be afraid. With concern, love, care and compassion for his friends Jesus tested their faith and belief in him by inviting Peter to come to him on the water. Jesus called out, "Come." I really appreciate this word come, because for me it is an invitation given to us all to enter into the fullness of life with Jesus. To see, hear and act as Jesus did. Jesus is the same yesterday, today and forever. Doubt no longer but believe. What a challenge?



We experience the awesome presence of God in our daily lives when we are alerted by the Holy Spirit to the wonder of creation in all its form, substance and beauty. We can become absorbed into the splendor, the mystery and majestic power of our loving God. These are the WOW moments of our lives through which we can express our joy - filled delight, love and appreciation and know the peace of God which surpasses all understanding.

On the other hand there are moments of disbelief. We are tried and tested when sin, uncertainty and darkness surround us. When the pains of life can become a burden on our mental, physical, psychological and spiritual wellbeing, we can take comfort in knowing that Jesus walks with us in the midst of all our trials. Our depth of faith and trust in God's presence supports and sustains us. This is very real. The following extracts from the beautiful Psalm No 139:11-12 assures us of this "Let the darkness hide me and the light around me be nigh!!! - even darkness is not dark for you (Lord) and night is as clear as the day." Psalm 139:23-24, "O search me, God, and know my heart. O test me and know my thoughts, - see that I follow not the wrong path and lead me in the path of life eternal." Stay with me Lord . 






## New in our Shop! Available for \$35


A Cathedral's large, voluminous space with its curved sandstone arches and wooden floors creates a unique resonant space, reflecting the sound off surfaces.
