
Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A- 1st February 2026

In our modern world, tribalism often defines how we navigate our daily lives. We are constantly asked to identify which group we belong to—whether it is the political party we support, the AFL team we cheer for on a Saturday afternoon, or even the "type" of Catholic we consider ourselves to be. We find comfort in these labels because they tell us where we fit. When we hear the Beatitudes in today's Gospel, we often bring this same mindset to the text. We try to find our "category," thinking, "I'm not a peacemaker, I'm too argumentative," or "I'm not mourning right now, so this doesn't apply to me."

But Jesus isn't handing out badges to different departments of the Church. He is describing the changing seasons of a faithful life. In the rugged landscape of Tasmania, we know the weather can change in an instant; you can start a hike in the sun and finish it in a shroud of mist. Our spiritual lives are no different. The Beatitudes are not static labels, but moments of encounter that we will all experience at different times.

There are seasons when we are "poor in spirit," feeling our inadequacy through ill health, financial struggle, or our own mistakes. In that emptiness, we aren't failing; we are simply making space for God. There are seasons of mourning, which is not a permanent identity but a valley we must walk through, finding blessing in the comfort that meets us there. There are moments when we are called to be gentle or merciful—not because it is our natural personality, but because we choose to be in the heat of a family disagreement or a stressful day.

When we view these as a cycle of human experience, the pressure to "fit" one category disappears. We realize that the person in the pew next to us isn't part of a different "tribe"; they are a fellow traveller, one of the many in the body of Christ who has likely known both the hunger for justice and the need for mercy. Whichever Beatitude you are living right now, that is exactly where Jesus is standing, calling you "Blessed."
