### Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe 23RD NOVEMBER 2025

Back some 1000 years before Christ the Israelites were governed by Judges. One of the most famous of these was Samuel who was coming towards the end of his earthly life. The people petitioned Samuel to ask God to appoint a King to rule over them just like all the other nations around them.

God did not think this was wise and through Samuel told the people just that but the people kept on petitioning for a King so God granted them their petition. The story of the first kings of Israel is complicated yet through it we find the anointing of David. David as a King brings the people of Israel together a one nation and succeeds in capturing the city of Jerusalem. Because he walked with God and completed what God wanted from him, God declared that he would establish a permanent kingdom through a descendant of David.

We call this the "Davidic Covenant' and we see this covenant being fulfilled through the person of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. Jesus lineage on both sides of his earthly parents Mary and Joseph can be traced back to King David and through his death and resurrection Jesus became the new Temple and the spiritual King of a Kingdom that would last forever.

We see this in our Gospel today form Luke where Jesus has been crucified along with two criminals, one on his left and the other on the right. The Romans placed an inscription above his head saying, "This is the King of the Jews" and then we have the conversation with the criminal on his right who implores Jesus to remember him when he comes into His Kingdom.

This is what we are celebrating Today on the Solemnity of "Christ the King". Celebrated on the final Sunday of the liturgical year. This gives us occasion to reflect on the Kingship of Christ, a King like no other who gave up his life in order to save us all. In truth Christ is both the ruler of all while simultaneously being the servant of all leading all of us into recognition of our kingship and therefore the responsibility to care of all those around us and also as custodians of God's creation.

As St. Paul says in his letter to the Colossians that God through His Son has taken us out of the power of darkness and created a place for us in the Kingdom of His Son that he loves.

Indeed. A worthy and powerful reason for our Celebration of "Christ as our King."

### READINGS OF THE DAY THIRTY THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME—YEAR C

### **Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe**

### First Reading 2 Samuel 5:1-3

All the tribes of Israel came to David at Hebron. 'Look' they said 'we are your own flesh and blood. In days past when Saul was our king, it was you who led Israel in all their exploits; and the Lord said to you, "You are the man who shall be shepherd of my people Israel, you shall be the leader of Israel."' So all the elders of Israel came to the king at Hebron, and King David made a pact with them at Hebron in the presence of the Lord, and they anointed David king of Israel.

### Responsorial Psalm Ps 121:1-5. R. see v.2

### (R.) Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord.

I rejoiced when I heard them say: 'Let us go to God's house.' And now our feet are standing within your gates, O Jerusalem. (R.)
