Thirsty for Truth....

Fr. John Wallis was giving an eight day retreat many years ago and I was one of the retreatants. I vividly remember discussing with him the Gospel Passage for today's liturgy, 'The Samaritan woman at the Well,'(jn.4:5-48). There was an air of excitement around Fr John's approach to the reading. This account of the ministry of Jesus towards the woman may have been one of his favourite gospel stories. As we

read, reflected, discussed and prayed together, I felt a joyful energy in that experience as Fr John drew me into the Gospel scene. Some aspects of this encounter are burnt into my memory. During one session I suddenly blurted out; "but I feel empty!" to which Fr.John gently replied; "Oh that's good. This means that God is there and you are not! It's all God's work." That wasn't the response I was expecting. My well was empty and how was I to fill it? I needed to



be open to the spirit and be surprised. Occasionally I recall this and ponder the words from(jn.3:30) "He must increase and I must decrease" and again from(LK.17:5) with the Apostles, 'Lord, increase my faith.'

Jesus asked the woman to give him a drink. When the throat is dry and burning, water is the best thing to lubricate it and ease the discomfort. Water is a vital need for it gives and sustains life. Isn't this what Jesus wanted to offer the woman. To heal her past, renew her spirit and fill her with peace and love that will give her new life and sustain her forever. Salvation is for all who seek it. Water is such a precious gift from God as it sustains and gives life in the spirit. Once Jesus spoke to the woman her life began to change for the better. Jesus wants to free us from our burdens and to know that as much as we want to be loved by God, so too does he want us to love him in return.

Precautions concerning Corona Virus

Dear Parishioners,

As you are no doubt aware, the first reported case of Corona Virus has been reported in Tasmania. While health authorities consider Tasmanians to be at low risk, it would be prudent to put a number of precautions in place in our parishes.

Thus, I propose the following:

- 1. That Communion from the Chalice be suspended at this time.
- 2. That the Sign of Peace at Mass not include a handshake. A gesture of recognition or other sign could be used.
- 3. It is recommended that in greeting people after the Mass, the priest refrain from shaking hands.
- 4. That ministers of the altar use hand sanitizer before and after Mass. This would include those assisting with the distribution of Holy Communion.
- 5. That the sacred vessels be thoroughly washed after every Mass.
- **6**. Consideration could be given to providing a hand sanitizer coming to and leaving the celebration of Mass.

These precautions will remain in place until we receive advice from health authorities that they can be lifted.




