THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD C-1ST JUNE 2025

The Ascension of Jesus Christ, is a foundational mystery of our Catholic faith. Forty days after His glorious Resurrection, Christ's visible departure from His disciples marks not an abandonment, but a profound transition in His redemptive work and the inauguration of the Church's mission, empowered by the Holy Spirit.

St. Luke concludes his Gospel with a poignant and concise description of the Ascension. Jesus leads His disciples out to Bethany, a place rich with memories of His friendship and teaching. There, "lifting up his hands, he blessed them. Now as he blessed them, he withdrew from them and was carried up to heaven." (Luke 24:50-51).

This final act of blessing is highly significant. It is a priestly gesture, reminiscent of the Old Testament priests blessing the people. Christ, our Eternal High Priest, bestows His final, definitive blessing upon His nascent Church, empowering them for the mission ahead. His departure is not sorrowful for the disciples; rather, they "worshipped him and then went back to Jerusalem full of joy, and they were continually in the temple praising God." (Luke 24:52-53). Their joy stems from a deeper understanding of Christ's glorification and the promise of the Holy Spirit, which they now eagerly await.

Luke elaborates on the Ascension at the very beginning of the Acts of the Apostles, setting the stage for the Church's birth and expansion. Here, the disciples' lingering earthly expectations are evident as they ask, "Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?" (Acts 1:6). Jesus gently redirects their focus from political restoration to the mission of His Church: "It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judea and Samaria, and indeed to the end of the earth." (Acts 1:7-8).

Immediately after this missionary mandate, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight. The cloud is a biblical symbol of God's presence and glory signifying Christ's divine nature and His entry into the heavenly realm. Two men in white robes then appear, reassuring the disciples. This angelic message provides crucial eschatological hope, affirming Christ's promised return in glory.

The Ascension, is a triumphant and transformative event. It confirms Christ's divine authority, initiates the age of the Holy Spirit, empowers the Church for its mission, and offers humanity the glorious hope of eternal life with God. It calls us to lift our hearts to heaven while keeping our feet firmly planted on earth, actively living out our faith and proclaiming the Good News until Christ comes again in glory.

READINGS OF THE DAY – THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD C

First Reading

Acts of the Apostles 1:1-11

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is,' he had said, 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit'

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.'

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'

This you can tell from the strength of his power at work in Christ, when he used it to raise him from the dead and to make him sit at his right hand, in heaven, far above every Sovereignty, Authority, Power, or Domination, or any other name that can be named, not only in this age, but also in the age to come. He has put all things under his feet, and made him, as the ruler of everything, the head of the Church; which is his body, the fullness of him who fills the whole creation.
