BLESSED ARE THOSE WHO TAKE REFUGE IN HIM

Every word Jesus spoke during his teaching ministry was packed with everyday imagery. Today's gospel is an example of that, "Come to me, all of you who labour and are overburdened, and I will give you rest" (Mt 11:25-30). The people to whom Jesus spoke these words were overburdened by the laws and regulations which were imposed upon them. Jesus wanted to assure the crowd, including his disciples, that his Father has sent him to spread the news of his Kingdom of love, forgiveness, peace and truth. For the Lord God said: "Deep within them, I will implant my law writing it on their hearts" (Jer3:33). It is not the proud or clever to whom the Father has revealed but to the humble and to those "mere children", whose hearts are open to the love of Christ. Jesus reminds us, "Learn from me for I am gentle and humble of heart and you will find rest for your souls" (Mt11:29). The words and images of everyday experiences, that Jesus uses, paint mental pictures of truth. Jesus expresses his readiness and availability to carry and heal our burdens. The word yoke conjures up images, for example, of draught horses tethered together displaying their ploughing skills, preparing the earth for planting, and oxen carefully maneuvering their heavy load along mountain ledges or a woman balancing a bamboo pole across her shoulder supporting containers of water, sometimes seventy kilos of food and wood. Those images depict physical burdens but often it is the spiritual burdens of the mind and heart which can weigh heavily upon our spirit. It is in the Sacrament of Reconciliation we are healed and freed from our worries and burdens. Do we, as followers of Jesus, take up his words seriously? Do we truly forgive others as God has forgiven us? This is why Jesus says, "My yoke is easy and my burden is light" (Mt11:30). Certainly, we can do this through the grace of the Holy Spirit. May those who take refuge in the Lord be blessed. Amen.

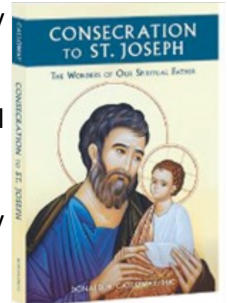
