Our Lord JESUS CHRIST, KING of the UNIVERSE



Next weekend, as a Church, the liturgical year concludes with the celebration of the Feast of Christ the King, officially known as the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of

the Universe. This is a glorious celebration of the Lord who reigns in our lives.

In 1925, the Feast day was established by Pope Pius XI with his encyclical *Quas primas*, to respond to a world that was rejecting Christ and was being dominated by secularism, material advantage and false hope created by tyrants.

Pope Pius hoped that the establishment of this feast would bring about the following:

- That this annual celebration would assist the faithful to gain strength in their true King, Jesus Christ;
- That leaders and nations would recognise that they are bound to submit and give respect to Christ the King;
- That nations would see that the Church has the right to freedom, and immunity from the state. In these times when we are challenged in our faith and our ability to worship together, let us remember that Jesus Christ is Our King who reigns forever.
- That individuals should honour and recognise Jesus as their 'Sovereign King' and emulate his total gift of self, perfectly embodied on the Cross. In imitation of their thorn-crowned King, individuals can help bring love and relief to those who suffer and help to proclaim the Good News of the Reign of Christ in the world today.

Pope Pius XI asked for this annual celebration to be a time for the faithful to consecrate themselves or renew their consecration to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, tying the celebration of devotion to the Sacred Heart and to the living Christ in the Eucharist.

REFLECTION - 33RD SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

"In the gospel, Christ prophesied the end of a time in the history of Israel. This culminated with the destruction of the temple around 70 AD. He also spoke of the imminent hardships and persecution before, during and after this time. However, He concludes with these encouraging words: "Your endurance will win you your lives."

Hence, the Lord encourages us to persevere in righteousness, and endure difficult moments. By warning that the Temple of Jerusalem would be destroyed in spite of its elegance and greatness, Christ also reminds us that nothing of this world will last forever no matter how precious they are to us. The only thing that will endure is our soul and faith in Christ.

Finally, today in our families, offices, businesses, careers and in our world, at large, we face difficulties that at times question our faith. However, if we endure all these patiently as Christ tell us, we shall have enough reasons to smile at the end, and of course, "the sun of righteousness will shine on us with healing in its rays."



READINGS OF THE DAY - 33RD SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME - YEAR C

First Reading Malachi 3:19-20

The day is coming now, burning like a furnace; and all the arrogant and the evil-doers will be like stubble. The day that is coming is going to burn them up, says the Lord of hosts, leaving them neither root nor stalk. But for you who fear my name, the sun of righteousness will shine out with healing in its rays.

Responsorial Psalm Psalm 97:5-9. R. see v.9

(R.) The Lord comes to rule the earth with justice.

- 1. Sing psalms to the Lord with the harp with the sound of music. With trumpets and the sound of the horn acclaim the King, the Lord.
- 2. Let the sea and all within it, thunder; the world, and all its peoples. Let the rivers clap their hands and the hills ring out their joy at the presence of the Lord.
- 3. For the Lord comes. he comes to rule the earth. He will rule the world with justice and the peoples with fairness.

2 Thessalonians 3:7-12 Second Reading

You know how you are supposed to imitate us: now we were not idle when we were with you, nor did we ever have our meals at anyone's table without paying for them; no, we worked night and day, slaving and straining, so as not to be a burden on any of you. This was not because we had no right to be, but in order to make ourselves an example for you to follow.

We gave you a rule when we were with you: not to let anyone have any food if he refused to do any work. Now we hear that there are some of you who are living in idleness, doing no work themselves but interfering with everyone else's. In the Lord Jesus Christ, we order and call on people of this kind to go on quietly working and earning the food that they eat.

Gospel Luke: 21:5-19 When some were talking about the Temple, remarking how it was adorned with fine stonework and votive offerings, Jesus said, 'All these things you are staring at now – the time will come when not a single stone will be left on another: everything

will be destroyed.' And they

put to him this question: 'Master,' they said, 'when will this happen, then, and what sign will there be that this is about to take place?'

'Take care not to be deceived,' he said, 'because many will come using my name and saying, "I am he" and, "The time is near at hand." Refuse to join them. And when you hear of wars and revolutions, do not be frightened, for this is something that must happen but the end is not soon.' Then he said to them, 'Nation will fight against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be great earthquakes and plagues and famines here and there; there will be fearful sights and great signs from heaven. 'But before all this happens, men will seize you and persecute you: they will hand you over to the synagogues and to imprisonment, and bring you before kings and governors because of my name and that will be your opportunity to bear witness. Keep this carefully in mind: you are not to prepare your defence, because I myself shall give you an eloquence and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to resist or contradict. You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, relations and friends; and some of you will be put to death. You will be hated by all men on account of my name, but not a hair of your head will be lost. Your endurance will win you your lives.'
