Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament

When: Saturday: 4pm – 4.30pm Where: St Mary's Cathedral

Adoration is a way to be present with the Lord and focus on actively listening to His word through prayer. During Adoration, pray to Jesus Christ, who is present in the Eucharist. The Eucharist, also referred to as the Blessed Sacrament. In the presence of the Eucharist, we pray to the power and sacrifice that it represents — **the body of Jesus, who gave His life so that we may live.**

It is **His body, blood, soul and divinity that is really, truly, and substantially present in the Eucharist**. Being in the presence of the body, blood, soul and divinity of Jesus Christ gives spiritual strength and nourishment in a uniquely powerful way. It is also important to make time to just sit in God's presence and listen. **Ask God to speak to your mind and heart and give you all the graces and guidance you need.** The benefits of praying in the presence of the Eucharist, and the Magisterium of the Catholic Church teaches us that the Eucharist is the 'source and summit of the life and mission of the Church'.

Why did God make you?

The great philosopher, Plato once said: "No one is more hated than he who speaks the truth." Plato was right, and in today's society where relativism is greatly appreciated, his statement cannot be questioned. It is difficult to be a *True* believer in our modern-day society since many look to convenient sources for convenient truths.

The first reading of today, *Amos 7:12-15* teaches us that real truth can never be convenient. Real truth challenges, transforms and impels one to



be better. This is the only type of truth that all believers must yearn for. God alone is this truth. For believers, the truth is that – God made us to know Him, love Him, and serve Him in this world, and to be happy with Him for ever in the next, CCC. Prophet Amos served this truth and was persecuted as a result, yet he never ceased to remind the people of this truth.

What good is it for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul? Mark 8:36. In truth, a life that does not care about its soul is an empty life. Let us not pursue worldly philosophies/lives at the expense of a blessed life with God. Let us make time each day for God; meditating on his words and spending time with him in prayer. As taught by St Paul: "God chose us to be holy and spotless, and to live through love in his presence, determining that we should become his adopted sons, through Jesus Christ, Ephesians 1:4-5."

Includes lots of time for discussion, faith sharing, getting to know one another, and prayer.



Catechist Formation for the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd:


