"Jesus Touched Him"

God, out of his infinite mercy, compassion and love, took on our human form. Through Mary's consent to the virgin birth, Jesus came to live among us to renew human life by bringing healing, harmony and peace into a broken world by fulfilling the will of his Father. The world as we know it today is in many ways destructive and is struggling in its efforts to discover the truth of all that exists. What is the truth you may ask?

GOD IS THE TRUTH. Jesus came into the world to witness to the truth (JN 18:37), to be a light in the darkness by the establishment of the Kingdom of God among all peoples. We know that loving God and obeying his commands is the pathway to our eternal home. God's love is for all who avoid all that is evil and destructive of life. "I turn to you, O Lord, in times of trouble and you fill me with the joy of salvation."(PS.31.)

Jesus heals a leper. (MK.1: 40-43.) The fact that the leper came humbly to Jesus kneeling before him and pleading to be cured presents to us today an expression of true faith and trust in Jesus. "If you want to, you can cure me." 'Feeling sorry for him, Jesus stretched out his hand and touched him.' to reassure him. 'Of course, I want to - be cured.' This story presents to us the divine authority with which Jesus acted as well as his deep human love and compassion towards the leper, the outcast of society. Lord Jesus, heal us of all our leprosy of mind, heart and spirit. Give us a spirit of compassion and help us to bring harmony in the world around us.

When have you felt the need for Jesus to stretch out his hand to you? Do you come to him with pure faith and confidence? 'I am with you always, even to the end of time.'


Lenten Resource Books:

READINGS OF THE DAY - 6th SUNDAY of ORDINARY TIME YEAR B

First Reading Leviticus 13:1-2, 44-46

The Lord said to Moses and Aaron, 'If a swelling or scab or shiny spot appears on a man's skin, a case of leprosy of the skin is to be suspected. The man must be taken to Aaron, the priest, or to one of the priests who are his sons.

'The man is leprous: he is unclean. The priest must declare him unclean; he is suffering from leprosy of the head. A man infected with leprosy must wear his clothing torn and his hair disordered; he must shield his upper lip and cry, "Unclean, unclean". As long as the disease lasts he must be unclean; and therefore he must live apart; he must live outside the camp.'

Responsorial Psalm Psalm 31:1-2, 5, 11

- (R.) I turn to you, Lord, in time of trouble, and you fill me with the joy of salvation.
- Happy the man whose offence is forgiven, whose sin is remitted.
 O happy the man to whom the Lord imputes no guilt, in whose spirit is no guile. (R.)
- But now I have acknowledged my sins; my guilt I did not hide. I said: 'I will confess my offence to the Lord.' And you, Lord, have forgiven the guilt of my sin. (R.)

Second Reading 1 Corinthians 10:31-11:1

Whatever you eat, whatever you drink, whatever you do at all, do it for the glory of God. Never do anything offensive to anyone – to Jews or Greeks or to the Church of God; just as I try to be helpful to everyone at all times, not anxious for my own advantage but for the advantage of everybody else, so that they may be saved.

Take me for your model, as I take Christ.

Gospel Mark 1:40-45

A leper came to Jesus and pleaded on his knees: 'If you want to' he said 'you can cure me.' Feeling sorry for him, Jesus stretched out his hand and touched him. 'Of course I want to!' he said. 'Be cured!' And the leprosy left him at once and he was cured. Jesus immediately sent him away and sternly ordered him, 'Mind you say nothing to anyone, but go and show yourself to the priest, and make the offering for your healing prescribed by Moses as evidence of your recovery.' The man went away, but then started talking about it freely and telling the story everywhere, so that Jesus could no longer go openly into any town, but had to stay outside in places where nobody lived. Even so, people from all around would come to him.
