3rd SUNDAY of ADVENT YEAR B - 17th DECEMBER 2023 **Gaudete Sunday**

My dear brothers and sisters all of us are happy being Christians. Our faith does not make us long-faced. We are enthusiastic and happy. Even in Lent, though we reflect on the passion of Christ, the Sunday at the midpoint of the journey to Easter has a theme of rejoicing. In the same way, on this third Sunday of Advent, our liturgy takes up a joyous theme. In our first reading, from Isaiah, the prophet calls us to be filled with joy. In the name of God, he is spirit filled and brings us 'good news' of encouragement, healing, freedom, and an outpouring of God's special favour. This message is especially for 'the poor' - those who have no security except in God. So, this proclamation was read by Jesus in the synagogue of Nazareth. And he added, 'This text is being fulfilled today, even as you listen'. As the text continues, the prophet 'exults for joy', using marriage themes to express the covenant bond of love between the chosen people and their God.

The second reading from first Thessalonians brings us to the climax with its reference to 'the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ'. It is a good choice, because the reading takes up today's theme of joy. Paul refers to a few actions, that unite the early Christian community and this provides a useful check list to evaluate the life of our own communities: 'constant prayer', thankfulness to the Father, offered in and through Christ; an openness to the promptings of the Spirit that comes through members who are in tune with God's ways ('the gift of prophecy'); and the 'peace' that is the fruit of all these shared blessings. True joy comes with the experience of what we are made for; the joy brought by Christian faith, the joy all true believers have experienced, the joy that only God can give, comes through the things Paul speaks of.

And then comes the important figure, John the Baptist in the Gospel reading according to John. John the Baptist guides us through the season of Advent, He has revived the ways of Israel's prophets and has caused quite a stir, and the authorities of Jerusalem send interrogators who asked him to give an account of himself. But he clearly said, he is not the messiah; he is not one of the old prophets come back to life; he is not the New Moses of Israel's expectations and that his role is that of a herald, 'a voice crying in the wilderness', that announces one who stands among the crowd, still 'unknown' to them. So, the description of his witness in this Gospel passage leaves his hearers eager to know more of the one to whom this great figure shows such reverence, 'the true light' that is going to transform a darkened world.

READINGS OF THE DAY - 3rd SUNDAY of ADVENT YEAR B

First Reading Isaiah 61:1-2, 10-11

The spirit of the Lord has been given to me, for the Lord has anointed me. He has sent me to bring good news to the poor, to bind up hearts that are broken; to proclaim liberty to captives, freedom to those in prison; to proclaim a year of favour from the Lord. 'I exult for joy in the Lord, my soul rejoices in my God, for he has clothed me in the garments of salvation, he has wrapped me in the cloak of integrity, like a bridegroom wearing his wreath, like a bride adorned in her jewels. 'For as the earth makes fresh things grow, as a garden makes seeds spring up, so will the Lord make both integrity and praise spring up in the sight of the nations.'

Responsorial Psalm

Luke 1:46-50, 53-54 R. Is 61:10

(R.) My soul rejoices in my God.



This is how John appeared as a witness. When the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, 'Who are you?' he not only declared, but he declared quite openly, 'I am not the Christ.' 'Well then,' they asked, 'are you Elijah?' 'I am not,' he said. 'Are you the Prophet?' He answered, 'No.' So they said to him, 'Who are you? We must take back an answer to those who sent us. What have you to say about yourself?' So John said, 'I am, as Isaiah prophesied: a voice that cries in the wilderness:

Make a straight way for the Lord.'

Now these men had been sent by the Pharisees, and they put this further question to him, 'Why are you baptising if you are not the Christ, and not Elijah, and not the prophet?' John replied, 'I baptise with water; but there stands among you – unknown to you – the one who is coming after me; and I am not fit to undo his sandal-strap.' This happened at Bethany, on the far side of the Jordan, where John was baptising.

The third Sunday of Advent is known as "Gaudete Sunday," from the Latin word for "rejoice." It is called this, from the first words of the second reading, because Christmas is near and the Church lifts the penitential atmosphere of Advent to turn our hearts to the joy that is to come.
