

WHO CAN THIS BE?

St Mark (Ch. 4 v 35-41) records for us a short, direct event in the life of Jesus and his disciples in which the humanity and divinity of Jesus was revealed to his chosen friends and includes us today. The Gospel passage begins with an invitation from Jesus to his disciples to leave the crowd and to come away with him. Stepping into a boat Jesus said, "Let us cross to the other side," the other side of the Sea of Galilee. (I have heard it said that the Sea of Galilee is similar in size and look to the Hobart Derwent River.) Seemingly, Jesus wanted some quiet time in order to pray to his heavenly Father and to relax after giving so much of himself to the people. Jesus wanted to further the disciples, understanding of his power and authority. Little did these companions know of



the challenges which lay ahead of them. Their trust and faith in the power of Jesus was soon to be put to the test. Presumably there were other fishermen in the other boats who also would be witnesses to the miracle which was soon to take place. Suddenly the fury of the wind whipped the water into large rolling waves which began to swamp the boat to sinking level. How afraid, and scary this experience must have been for all especially as the violent storm began to roll in over them. Jesus was comfortably sleeping on a cushion. Wasn't he aware of the dangers surrounding his friends? "Master do you not care? We are going down." Jesus woke up and rebuked the wind. "Quiet now. Be calm." Jesus said to his companions. "Why are you so frightened? How is it that you have no faith!? Filled with awe they said to one another. WHO CAN THIS BE? Even the wind and the sea obey him.

It is an honest fact that each of us personally have experienced turmoil of one kind or another throughout our lives be it physical, mental, emotional or spiritual or just meeting the needs of every day living. It can feel like being tossed about on the sea of life. Yet whilst on the surface life can seem rough deep down through our living faith we can experience and know the supportive presence of God who is in control of all our needs. Put yourself in the boat with Jesus and hear him say to you "Quiet now – be calm; trust me and all will be well". The boat in today's Gospel symbolizes our Church – God's chosen people being tossed about on the sea of life. Let us not lose heart but trust in the will of God and pray and work for peace, healing and harmony in the world. Why are you so frightened, How is it you have no faith? Open your eyes, ears and heart. I am with you always. WHO CAN THIS BE?
