Week Two — The Story of the Eucharist

The whole story of salvation history is a single narrative, culminating in the climactic gift of the Eucharist. The Eucharist was prefigured in the Old Testament and was fully revealed to us in Jesus' life, miracles, teaching, and sacrifice.

FORMED

IN HIM WE TRUST

An old monk said to his disciples: "Trust in yourself, and you are doomed to disappointment: trust in your friends, and they will die and leave you; trust in money, and you may have it taken from you; trust in reputation, and some slanderous tongue may blast it. But trust in God, and you are never to be confounded in time or eternity." Trusting in God alone, Jairus, a man of considerable eminence in his own town, came and fell at Jesus' feet, asking in faith for him to heal his daughter. In the incident that followed, when Jesus asked who had touched him, the



haemorrhaging woman also came and fell at his feet, describing what had happened to her as the result of her faith. But the people came from Jairus' house showed only little faith, doubting that whether Jesus had power over death.

Now the question is where do we stand in these incidents? How do we look at Jesus? Is he some wonder worker of the past? Was he perhaps a very holy man, an outstanding combination of generosity and humility? How deeply do we believe that Jesus Christ is our saviour? If we have observed our surroundings from the last few weeks, we might have seen that many of our attitudes about faith and the Christian life are formed by the world, and if we were to look around, it would become clear to us that this world functions with the faith in material things. Yet, I understand it is the same environment, which often forms our thoughts about our saviour, who died for us. Just like St Paul says "Christ's death on the cross is nonsense to those who are being lost: but for us who are being saved, it is God's power" (1 Cor 1: 18)

When we act in envy or bitterness, does this not signify a lack of faith? Are we not, in effect, saying: "I have a right to be angry because nobody not even God is looking after my interests"? Dear friends, in today's Gospel Jesus wants us to put aside thoughts like these so that our faith can become more like that of Jairus and the haemorrhaging woman. He wants to tell us, "Do not worry, only trust". He can say this only if we have begun to put off our old attitudes and mindsets and take on a new mind that is formed in his image. We need to come before God in humility today and ask Him to increase our faith. Let us renounce the attitude of the world and ask the Holy Spirit to fill us with his gifts. Amen




Book Launch:
