DIVINE RENOVATION

St Mary's Cathedral Parish is embarking on a time of parish renewal.



The question is "How do we continue to bring people to Jesus Christ in a society and culture that are constantly moving away from that relationship?"

"What would it look like if a parish was full of missionary disciples on fire for mission?

The Parish has been working together on Divine Renovation which is a Catholic ministry dedicated to parish renewal. We believe that in order to thrive, a parish must fully embrace its missionary identity. Fr James Mallon, who was a Parish Priest of Saint Benedict Parish in Halifax, Nova Scotia, Canada, first book "Divine Renovation - From a Maintenance to a Missional Parish" was published in 2014 and since then The International Divine Renovation network now extends to Australia and New Zealand. In October 2020, Divine Renovation Australasia was launched. Kevin Bailey the Australasia Regional Director for Divine Renovation writes "We recognise the primacy of Evangelisation, animated and led with reliance on the Holy Spirit and a focus on the best leadership principles and practices." As the Gospel proclaims, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you." – Matthew 28:19-20

REFLECTION 20TH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

On this twentieth Sunday of Ordinary Time, the Church draws our attention to God's invitation and mercy to humanity. God's invitation and mercy are without borders. This means that we all have equal opportunities in our response of faith.

Today's gospel goes further to illustrate the universality of God's mercy. However, the fact that Jesus initially hesitated to listen to the woman perhaps could have been to test her faith. In other words, even though God is ready to show us mercy, he requires something from us: "faith as small as the mustard seed" (Mt 17: 20). An essential requirement for receiving this mercy is the amount of faith we demonstrate in Jesus Christ.

The woman demonstrated her faith in Christ. Of course, Christ showed her mercy by healing her daughter. Her persistence is also worth emulating. Despite all odds and what looked like Jesus' refusal to answer her, she did not give up. So, like this Canaanite woman, each one needs God's mercy. We need to demonstrate our faith in Christ, and he will show us his mercy.

Today, Jesus is close to us. So, like this woman, we must cry to Him: "Son of David, take pity on me."





READINGS OF THE DAY - 20th SUNDAY in ORDINARY TIME YEAR A

First Reading

Isaiah 56:1, 6-7

Thus says the Lord: Have a care for justice, act with integrity, for soon my salvation will come and my integrity be manifest.

Foreigners who have attached themselves to the Lord to serve him and to love his name and be his servants - all who observe the sabbath, not profaning it, and cling to my covenant - these I will bring to my holy mountain. I will make them joyful in my house of prayer. Their holocausts and their sacrifices will be accepted on my altar, for my house will be called a house of prayer for all the peoples.

God never takes back his gifts or revokes his choice.

Just as you changed from being disobedient to God, and now enjoy mercy because of their disobedience, so those who are disobedient now - and only because of the mercy shown to you - will also enjoy mercy eventually. God has imprisoned all men in their own disobedience only to show mercy to all mankind.
