
Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In today's Gospel (Matthew 10:37ff), Jesus says that He must be first in our lives. No ifs or buts; if we don't put Jesus our Lord and Saviour first, we will not be worthy of Him. He calls us to radical obedience to His call to follow Him – to go where He tells us to go, to do what He is telling us to do. Just like those who responded to Jesus' invitation: "Follow Me!" when He walked the roads of Galilee, we too are called to let go of anything in our lives which will get in the way of putting love of God and obedience to God first in our lives.

This is a decision He invites us to make, not once in our lives, but every day. Every day we have to make the decision to put Jesus first — to take up whatever cross He gives us to carry and keep going forward with Him. This is the way that Jesus brings us into His life and makes us like Him.

As St Paul writes: "When we were baptised in Christ Jesus, we were baptised into His death; in other words, ... we went into the tomb with Him and joined Him in death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the Father's glory, we too might live a new life" (Rom 6:3ff).

The life Jesus promises us is abundant and eternal, but it can only be found in obedience to Him. In the end, there are only two choices. We either abandon our hearts to Jesus and invite Him to be Lord of every aspect of our lives, or we allow the great deceiver to convince us to put our own comfort or pleasure first or to indulge our own pride or willfulness or self-pity. This kind of self-love leads only to ruin, confusion and emptiness. There is no way to tame this or to fit religion into it. The only way is to allow Jesus to kill this tendency to selfishness in us.



This is the meaning of Jesus' words to St Peter: "When you were younger you dressed yourself and went where you wanted; but when you are old you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will dress you and lead you where you do not want to go" (John 21:18). Peter knew already that only by following Jesus would he find abundant and eternal life, but Jesus was reminding him that the amazing grace and mercy, which Jesus had died to give him, was not free. It had cost Jesus His life, and it would cost Peter his life too.

There is no such thing as cheap grace. We can only receive the Christ-life in us if we lay down our lives for Him.




In his book Father Calloway shows that St. Joseph has been gradually emerging from obscurity with recent popes calling upon his patronage for the Church in these perilous times.

New Booking System for Sunday Masses

For the foreseeable future, it will be necessary for people wishing to attend a Sunday Mass in the parish to book a place beforehand. Our numbers will continue to be limited, and so booking in beforehand is essential. Booking in for Sunday Masses has become easier because we have set up a TryBooking system using commercial software so people can book themselves in for Sunday Mass through the internet using a phone, tablet or computer.

To book a place at a Sunday Mass go to one of the following sites on the net.

For Mass at the Cathedral go to https://www.trybooking.com/BJWWU


For Mass at Sacred Heart go to https://www.trybooking.com/BJYJA

- When you get the page up, click on "Book Now" at the top of the page
- The full list of Mass times for the month will come up and for each you can see if places are still available.
- Pick one of the Masses which has available places and click on "select". A ticket panel will appear at the bottom of the page and on the right side of this panel press the + (plus) sign to select the number of people you are booking for.
- Click on the "next" button and you will be asked for the names of each person you are booking in and a phone number by which they can be contacted.
- When you have put in the names and phone numbers click on "next" and the final page appears where you need to put in your name again and your e-mail address.
- Now click on "purchase" at the bottom of the page, and you have completed the booking. The TryBooking system will show that your booking is successful and will send you an e-mail. You can print your tickets if you want to, but you will not need them to get into the Mass because the usher will have the list of who has booked in for that Mass.

There is no cost to booking in. Tickets are free.

If you do not have access to the internet you can still call Mrs Shilpi Santos in the parish office on 0408 778 152 or, after 3:00 pm, call Mr Alex Rodrigues on 0432 790 040 and they will be able to book you in.

Please use the TryBooking system to book yourself in for Sunday Masses if you can, since this will greatly ease the work load on our parish staff and volunteers who, because of government regulations, are having to do a lot of extra work now to allow us to come to Mass again.
