
Acts 6:2-3

REFLECTION 23RD SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

As St Paul tells us in today's second reading: love of neighbour is the hall-mark of Christianity from the very beginning. This love of neighbour presupposed love of God, for if God is not known and loved there can be no basis, no motive for true love of neighbour, which is charity. To a true Christian no person is a complete stranger. For we are all brothers and sisters in Christ, adopted children of God. Our principle interest in all persons is not a temporal but a spiritual one. We want them to get to heaven, but to do so they sometimes need a helping hand in this life. Thus true Christian charity urges us to encourage a brother or sister suffering from the burden of sin or simply feeling lost simply due to taking wrong decisions or life choices. St John tells us that our love of God can be judged by our active love of neighbour: "if anyone says he loves God and hates his brother, he is a liar" (1Jn 4:20). Unfortunately, there are far too many Christians today who pay no heed to the serious obligation of encouraging an erring brother or sister to give up his or her sinful ways. "If I say to the wicked, O wicked man, you shall surely die, and you do not speak to warn the wicked to turn from his way that wicked man shall die in his iniquity but his blood I will require at your hand. But if you warn the wicked to turn from his way; and he does not turn from his way; he shall die in his iniquity, but you will have saved your life". Shrugging this responsibility off by saying: I have more than enough to do to keep myself from sin or if I go to show someone else their ways I will lose their friendship or think that if I do it they would think that I am not a kind person is not the response that Christ is looking for. As Christians we are all God's prophets, God's representatives. We have been given the right and obligation of letting the light of our faith shine before all people. Whenever the occasion arise we are bound to help our fellowmen and women on the road to heaven BY OUR GOOD EXAMPLE AND CHARITABLE ADVICE.


Inside the homes, this responsibility falls on parents, for they must realize that their children are a gift from God, thus this gift is to be nurtured and carefully tended so that they would be precious as the day you received them from God. Outside the home all Christians are bound by charity to help their fellow men and women. Whether they be a non-Christian or a Christian, they are adopted sons and daughters of God and brothers and sisters of Jesus Christ. We Christians are watchmen, sentinels, placed on elevated places to give warning of approaching danger, even though they might not pay heed to our warning.

God wants to give us a share in the reaping of His harvest. It is only in heaven that we will realize how much our own salvation depended on the zeal and charity with which we helped our neighbour reach their eternal home.



READINGS OF THE DAY - 23rd SUNDAY in ORDINARY TIME YEAR A

First Reading Ezekiel 33:7-9

The word of the Lord was addressed to me as follows, 'Son of man, I have appointed you as sentry to the House of Israel. When you hear a word from my mouth, warn them in my name. If I say to a wicked man: Wicked wretch, you are to die, and you do not speak to warn the wicked man to renounce his ways, then he shall die for his sin, but I will hold you responsible for his death. If, however, you do warn a wicked man to renounce his ways and repent, and he does not repent, then he shall die for his sin, but you yourself will have saved your life.'

Responsorial Psalm

Psalm 94:1-2, 6-9. R. v.8

(R.) O that today you would listen to his voice. Harden not your hearts.

- Come, ring out our joy to the Lord; hail the rock who saves us. Let us come before him, giving thanks, with songs let us hail the Lord. (R.)
- 2. Come in; let us bow and bend low; let us kneel before the God who made us for he is our God and we the people who belong to his pasture, the flock that is led by his hand. (R.)
- 3. O that today you would listen to his voice! 'Harden not your hearts as at Meribah, as on that day at Massah in the desert when your fathers put me to the test; when they tried me, though they saw my work.' (R.)

Second Reading Romans 13:8-10

Avoid getting into debt, except the debt of mutual love. If you love your fellow men you have carried out your obligations. All the commandments: You shall not commit adultery, you shall not kill, you shall not steal, you shall not covet, and so on, are summed up in this single command: You must love your neighbour as yourself. Love is the one thing that cannot hurt your neighbour; that is why it is the answer to every one of the commandments.

Gospel Acclamation

May the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ enlighten the eyes of our heart, that we might see how great is the hope to which we are called.

Gospel Matthew 18:15-20

Jesus said to his disciples: 'If your brother does something wrong, go and have it out with him alone, between your two selves. If he listens to you, you have won back your brother. If he does not listen, take one or two others with you: the evidence of two or three witnesses is required to sustain any charge. But if he refuses to listen to these, report it to the community; and if he refuses to listen to the community, treat him like a pagan or a tax collector.

'I tell you solemnly, whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in heaven; whatever you loose on earth shall be considered loosed in heaven.

'I tell you solemnly once again, if two of you on earth agree to ask anything at all, it will be granted to you by my Father in heaven. For where two or three meet in my name, I shall be there with them.'
