#### FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER YEAR C - 18th MAY 2025

#### LOVE ONE ANOTHER AS I HAVE LOVED YOU.

(JN. 13 v 31-35) We know that at the Last Supper Judas had taken the piece of bread from the hand of Jesus. Was Jesus lovingly reaching out to Judas wanting him to change his mind? Satan had entered him and he chose to go out into the darkness of the night! The atmosphere in the Upper Room changed. Jesus had much to say to all those gathered around him about his close relationship and union with the Father. "The Father and I are one." (JN 10: v 30) "You are my friends if you do what I command you." (JN 15: v14) Jesus knew this was the time to prepare his friends for his departure from them. Humanly speaking this would have been very painful for Jesus, but his time had come to fulfil the will of the Father. In this farewell discourse Jesus was preparing his friends for a new way of being without his physical presence. The Holy Spirit will be given to them to guide them on their way. The disciples would come to a clearer understanding of all that Jesus said and did (love in action). Jesus speaks to us today as we gather around the Word and the Eucharistic Celebration, I give you a new commandment, love one another as I have loved you! As we endeavour to fulfil this commandment in our day to day relationships, we give praise and thanks to God, for his unbounding love for us and for all His creation, that sometimes we take for granted. Lord help us to be compassionate and loving towards our neighbours as you command.

As we read in Paul's prayer:

"Out of His infinite glory, may he give you the power through his Spirit for your hidden self to grow strong, so that Christ may live in your hearts through faith, and then, planted in love and built on love, you will with all the saints have strength to grasp the breath and the length, the height and the depth; until, knowing the love of Christ, which is beyond all knowledge, you are filled with the utter fullness of God (EP 3 v14-19)


#### Tuesday (20th May)—Fr Chris Hope

#### READINGS OF THE DAY – FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER YEAR C

# First Reading Acts of the Apostles 14:21-27

Paul and Barnabas went back through Lystra and Iconium to Antioch. They put fresh heart into the disciples, encouraging them to persevere in the faith. 'We all have to experience many hardships' they said 'before we enter the kingdom of God.' In each of these churches they appointed elders, and with prayer and fasting they commended them to the Lord in whom they had come to believe.

They passed through Pisidia and reached Pamphylia. Then after proclaiming the word at Perga they went down to Attalia and from there sailed for Antioch, where they had originally been commended to the grace of God for the work they had now completed.

On their arrival they assembled the church and gave an account of all that God had done with them, and how he had opened the door of faith to the pagans.

Then I heard a loud voice call from the throne, 'You see this city? Here God lives among men. He will make his home among them; they shall be his people, and he will be their God; his name is God-with-them. He will wipe away all tears from their eyes; there will be no more death, and no more mourning or sadness. The world of the past has gone.'

Then the One sitting on the throne spoke: 'Now I am making the whole of creation new.'
