

LOOK, YOUR GOD IS COMING!

We have all experienced and know how it feels to have to WAIT. We wait for a kettle to boil, a flower bud to unfold and expose its beauty, for fruit to ripen, a wound to heal, visiting friends to arrive, rain to fall and the sun to shine, and new life in all its forms. Waiting is fundamental to human existence. It can be a time of confusion



or reflection, concern or expectation. The first reading for today's liturgy comes from the Old Testament prophet Isaiah (Is 35:1-6). Isaiah assures us in such picturesque language that the whole of creation will 'sing for joy' at the 'first' coming of Christ which also announces Christ's second coming when he will establish his reign on earth as King of the Universe. 'Look, your God is coming - he is coming to save you.' I recommend to you all the readings from today's liturgy for your personal reflection, meditation and prayer. We are reminded to go out to the world with patience and courage armed with Christ's presence within our own being to seek out the poor and needy of our time. This third Sunday of Advent is traditionally known as Gaudette Sunday which means REJOICING. 'Rejoice in the Lord always and again I say rejoice" The joyful Rose coloured vestments are worn today which adds to the spirit of the season of Christmas as we celebrate two thousand plus anniversaries of Christ's birth. In the Gospel of Matthew (Mt 1: 2-11) we encounter John in prison waiting to be condemned to death at the hand of Herod. John had a momentary doubt about the authority of Jesus. "Are you the one who is to come or have we got to wait for someone else? Are you the promised Messiah?" Jesus sent his reply, "Go back and tell John what you hear and see; the blind see again, and the lame walk and the lepers are cleansed and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised to life and the 'Good News' is proclaimed to the poor and happy is the man (John) who does not lose faith in me. Is Matthew reminding us to see the signs of the kingdom around us and by word action and prayer enhance the lives of the needy around Sr Monica Shelveton PBVM us?

Fr Norberto Ochua will be offering three days of the Simbang Gabi (Dawn Mass) at the Cathedral at 5am on December 22, 23, 24 kindly assisted by Deacon Steven Smith.



Simbang Gabi is a Filipino Christmas tradition. It is (usually) a series of nine dawn Masses on the days leading up to Christmas. This tradition was introduced by the Spanish friars to allow the farmers to hear Mass before going to the fields early in the morning. The Masses can start as early as 4 in the morning. Simbang Gabi is also known by its popular Spanish name, Misa de Gallo, or "Mass of the Rooster."

In the olden days, the church bells start ringing as early as three o' clock, waking people up so they can get ready for the four o'clock dawn Mass. The Roman Catholic churches across the nation start to open their doors shortly before the break of dawn to welcome the faithful to the Simbang Gabi Mass.

BLESSING OF NATIVITIES

Given to mark the first Sunday of Advent in Greccio Italy at the Shrine of the Nativity, Pope Francis presented his most recent Apostolic Letter 'Admirabile Signum' ("Enchanting Image") on the Meaning and Importance of the Nativity Scene. A Nativity scene is a simple reminder of something astonishing: God became human to reveal the greatness of his love "by smiling and opening his arms to all," Pope Francis said in his letter on the meaning and importance of setting up Christmas cribs. The Holy Father wrote "I wish to encourage the beautiful family tradition of preparing the nativity scene in the days before Christmas, but also the custom of setting it up in the workplace, in schools, hospitals, prisons and town squares." He said "It is my hope that this custom will never be lost and that, wherever it has fallen into disuse, it can be rediscovered and revived."

To assist us in giving effect to the Holy Father's express desire to promote the worthy custom of establishing the Christmas Crib in our homes, His Grace Archbishop Porteous will at the 10:30am Mass on Sunday December 22 to bless the Cathedral's Nativity Scene and, in what is to become an annual event, invites families to bring with them to this Mass the baby Jesus and such other figures of their choosing from their own Nativity scenes which His Grace will also bless.

Dear Parishioners, as part of the Safe Communities Program, we would like to remind parents that it is their responsibility to escort children/minors to the bathroom during Masses. Also, children should not be left to run around unattended either within the Cathedral, the Cathedral Centre or the grounds. It is important that parents can see their children at all times. Quite apart from the issue of child safety, we have had a number of expensive breakages from curious little fingers in recent times in the lift and cloister area and with our security door buttons. 
