Go Out and Share the Good News

Dear Brothers and Sisters,
Today's Gospel tells how Jesus sent out 72 of His disciples in pairs to all the places which He was going to visit to tell the people that "The kingdom of God is very near to you." These were the original 'missionary disciples' and Jesus' instructions to them are just as important for us because we too are called, every one of us, to take the Good News of Jesus to the people around us. We are all commissioned by Jesus Our Lord and Saviour, through our daily living relationship with Him, to go out to transform the world – nothing less!

Note that the 72 were not sent to the Jews, the insiders, but to the Samaritans and the Gentiles, the outsiders. That is why Jesus twice tells them not to worry about observance of kosher food regulations. He said "Just eat what is set before you".

They were to go out of their comfort zone – no haversack, no purse. They needed to depend entirely on what Jesus had given them. They were given His grace to proclaim His message with His power. They were not to rely on their own resources. They were sent as lambs among wolves. But Who had sent them? – The Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. As lambs among wolves these missionary disciples of Jesus were to do the business His way – in His power and protected by His grace. Jesus would be with them in Spirit every step of the way.

They were to tell people that the reign of God was very near to them. In Jesus' Name they could be forgiven and healed. So many were. The message that the 72 spoke in Jesus' Name was backed up by the power of the Holy Spirit and many many people were healed and were embraced by God's love right where they were. Even the devils which bind people in oppression and addiction were cast out by these 72 missionary disciples through Jesus' power. They were amazed. Jesus saves. And Jesus even saves through His disciples who obediently went out in His Name. Jesus warned them that not everyone, and not every town, would accept them.

Don't worry – just keep on working. Go and try somewhere else.

Some will accept the Good News, and you will have the joy of seeing them healed and saved. Lastly, Jesus told them to pray for more labourers, more missionary disciples, to be sent to the vineyard. The best prayer for this essential work of the Church comes from those who are involved in it. Only they can really see how necessary, how difficult and how rewarding it is to share Christ with the world.

Let us take these words of Jesus to heart "The harvest is rich but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to His harvest."

In times Past ...

In mid-July 1949 the *Standard* printed three essays. These were some of the winning entries from a recent children's writing competition. Veronica Connolly of Burnie wrote of St Francis Xavier. She liked that he was athletic and smart. His role in the evangelisation of Asia was also noteworthy, and Veronica mentioned the laying of a relic of this saint upon an altar at 'the site of the atom-bombed church of Nagasaki'. Veronica got her prize by connecting timeless virtues, a saintly life, and the looming realities of modern times.



Betty Naylor of Queenstown scored her win by reciting a story that her friend 'once told me'. This concerned a priest called to a hospital for a dying man. Through a communication mishap the man's name was unknown, and the priest turned up to the hospital not knowing to whom he should go. Directed to an unconscious man thought to be mumbling the word

'Mary', he sat by the poor fellow for some time until he awoke and made a deathbed confession. Apparently he'd long prayed for a good death.

John O'Donnell of Zeehan wrote a more straightforward piece. 'I like all the stories in the Bible History,' he said, 'but my favourite is the following'. He then briefly recounted the Annunciation and Nativity. 'I like this story the best because it was the first Bible History story I ever heard,' he concluded, 'and because it reminds me of Christmas.'

Becoming Missionary Disciples

The Evangelium Conference is aimed at engaging Catholics in evangelisation. It will be held for the first time in Tasmania from August 30-31 at St Bernard's Church in Claremont. Themed 'Becoming Missionary Disciples', the conference will feature speakers, workshops, times of prayer and outreach. The theme is taken from Pope Francis' call for Christians to be 'missionary disciples'. "Every Christian is a missionary to the extent that he or she has encountered the love of God in Christ Jesus: we no longer say that we are 'disciples' and 'missionaries', but rather that we are always 'missionary disciples'," the Pope said, in his apostolic exhortation Evangelii Gaudium. Aimed at parishioners, teachers and youth, as well as priests and religious, the conference will have a particular focus on enabling parishes to develop a missionary spirit. The conference's keynote speaker is evangelist, and co-founder and managing director of the Catholic ministry menALIVE, Robert Falzon. Purchase of a conference ticket includes access to keynote addresses and workshops, lunch & dinner, morning & afternoon tea, tea and coffee. Attendees can choose to attend one presentation from each workshop:
